## GUIDE TO ROTHER FISHERY ASSOCIATION WATERS ON THE RIVER ROTHER

Start / end of fishery

For the Royal Military Canal (not shown here) the water runs BOTH BANKS from Appledore Dam to Iden Lock (junction River Rother)

The Rother is a shallow small stream (dace, chub, gudgeon, few trout etc.) on the upper reaches (down to about Bodiam.) From there it begins to get wider, slower and deeper, and bream become more common. In the summer the river lower down can suffer from duckweed. The whole river tends to suffer from low flows in the summer as well - it is heavily abstracted. In the past it has suffered from pollution, but it is now improved greatly; there is even a run of sea trout. Lower down, mullet can often be seen.
